

Starting point: entrance to Flat Run Veterans Park




Agent Editorials

Graduate Gossip

Let's learn together! A recent concept learned in one of my graduate courses is the relationship between obesity and sleep. Shorter periods of sleep generally produce weight gain as individuals are more likely to increase food intake. Interrupted sleep studies in relation to diet have found that participants intake foods with higher fats,




lower quality diets, and irregular eating behavior. Quality of sleep is indicative of body mass index (BMI) as well. One study of 522 patients showed that the number of night awakenings was positively correlated with increased BMI (Noh, 2018). Moral of the story? Get a good night's sleep and you are benefiting your body more ways than one
